Jeffery joined the Toronto Camera Club in 2010 and is a member of both CAPA and the Professional Photographers of Canada. Currently, Jeffery spends many months each year in east Africa where he leads photographic tours utilizing his intimate knowledge to design tour routes that optimise the possibility of creating great wildlife photography images.

AS a CAPA certified judge, Jeffery has judged

many competitions, and in 2016 was a judge for *Nature's Best Photography, Africa* – one of the most prestigious nature photographic competitions in the world. Over the years, Jeffery has received numerous awards in regional and international competitions. In June 2016, four of his images were invited to join the United Nation 2016 "Spirit of Eurasia" exhibition in New York. There, he was invited to give a lecture on "The subjective expression of photography", the first photographic lecture to be given at the UN New York headquarters.

Jeffery is also an author and educator and continues to give lectures and presentations on various photographic subjects. Jeffrey's works and articles have been published worldwide including The Times, CHASSES, The Guardian, Chinese National Geography, Canadian Camera, Outdoor Photography Canada, Daily Telegraph, Daily Mail, Cultural Geography etc.
